Friday, 5th September 2025

The Institution of Engineers of Kenya (IEK) successfully hosted the President's Dinner and Launch of the Site Inspection Handbook on Friday, 5th September 2025, at Emara Ole Sereni. The event, presided over by IEK President Eng. Shammah Kiteme, brought together leaders from government, regulatory bodies, and the engineering fraternity.

Key speeches were delivered by Eng. Jane Mutulili, ACEK President, Eng. Maurice Akech, Executive Director of the National Construction Authority, and Eng. Shammah Kiteme, who outlined IEK's priorities for strengthening professionalism in engineering.

A representative from the Council of Governors delivered the keynote address on behalf of the Chair of the Council of Governors, H.E. FCPA Ahmed Abdullahi, commending engineers for their role in infrastructure development and pledging closer collaboration with county governments.

A highlight of the evening was the official unveiling of the Site Inspection Handbook, launched jointly by Eng. Shammah Kiteme, Eng. Akech, and HE Abdullahi. The handbook is expected to streamline site inspection practices and improve standards across the country.

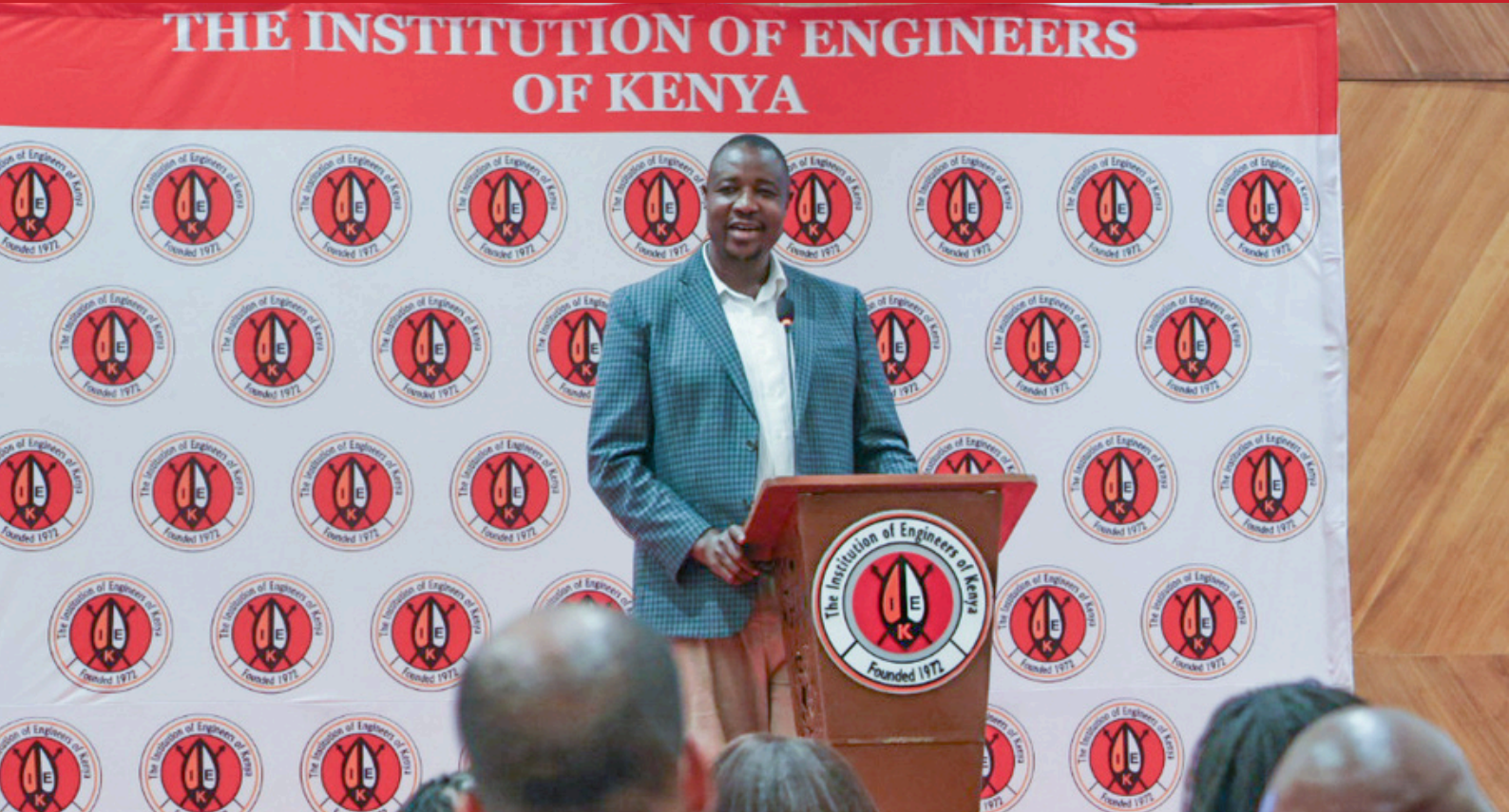

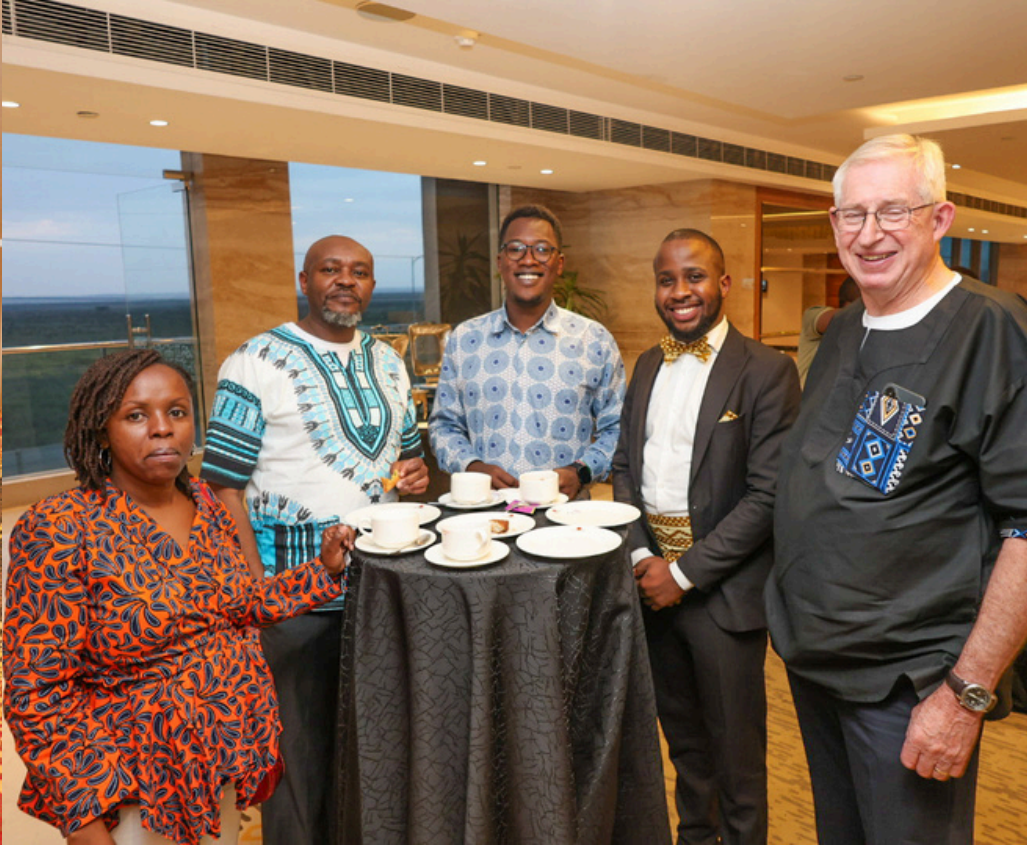

IEK Continues Calls for 10,000 Opportunities for Engineers at the Fixing the Nation Interview on NTV Tuesday, 2nd September 2025

The IEK President, Eng. Shammah Kiteme, attended the Fixing the Nation Live interview, where he addressed the pressing issue of unemployment in the engineering sector.

The Institution of Engineers of Kenya (IEK) had earlier used the Katiba Day platform to highlight this urgent concern. Despite the critical role engineers play in industrialization, infrastructure, and economic transformation, nearly half of the 27,000 registered engineers remain without jobs.

The petition presented during Katiba Day called for the creation of at least 10,000 opportunities within government projects, industry, and innovation hubs to ensure the nation fully benefits from the expertise and skills of its engineers.

IEK continues to advocate for policy reforms, structured graduate training programmes, and stronger linkages between academia, industry, and government to secure meaningful opportunities for engineers and, in turn, drive national development.

“Naturally, you’d expect every engineer to be busy but that’s not the scenario. We have over 27,000 engineers on the register, yet sadly about 50% are unemployed, and we are asking ourselves why. This is what we addressed last week during Katiba Day, when engineers marched and petitioned the authorities to create 10,000 opportunities for our profession.” — Eng. Shammah Kiteme, IEK President.

IEK SEEKS COURT INTERVENTION FOR FAIR TERMS OF SERVICE FOR ENGINEERS IN CIVIL SERVICE

THURSDAY, 4TH SEPTEMBER 2025



Fellow members,

The IEK moved to court to petition the judiciary to invoke the law and compel the Public Service Commission (PSC) to issue a circular for terms of service for Engineers in Civil Service to be improved. We particularly expect that on successful petition;

1. Engineers entry grade to civil service will be improved from the current CSG 10 to CSG 9
2. Engineers will enjoy risk allowance
3. Engineers will enjoy non-practising allowance

This move is a culmination of lengthy engagements with PSC which started on 15.12.2022. In March 2023, IEK submitted a proposal which was developed after several months of study and comparing the current terms of engagement for Engineers with those of Doctors, Lawyers, Architects among others.

In the course of this exercise, it became very clear that Engineers have been subjected to a grievous labour injustices. Subsequent to this submission, IEK continued to follow up with PSC. A two day retreat was held in Mombasa on 26th and 27th September 2023. In this retreat, PSC was represented by a Director and a Commissioner. IEK, EBK, KETRB and IET participated in this retreat. The retreat discussed the submission by IEK. After the retreat, there were follow up meetings with PSC on 24th May 2024 and 2nd May 2025. While PSC remained intransigent to the plight of Engineers, it issued a circular on 1st July 2025. This circular was a directive that lawyers engaged in civil service would enjoy non-practising allowance as one of their employment benefit.

Having been unsuccessful in engaging PSC to improve the terms of service for Engineers, the council decided to pursue the matter of correcting this injustice through the courts. It is our hope that the courts will grant the petition filed yesterday and allow Engineers to enjoy risk and non-practising allowances as well as review of the entry in civil service from CSG 10 to CSG 9.

1. Tell us a bit about yourself outside of your engineering profession.

I am Eng. Maureen Auka. Beyond engineering, I practise small scale farming with plans for large-scale fruit farming. I enjoy nature walks and also engage in women and youth empowerment through mentorship and community service.

2. What inspires or motivates you most in your day-to-day life, both personally and professionally.

I believe God has a plan and vision for my life. Discovering His purpose for me in every environment motivates me, knowing He places me in each situation for a reason.

3. What initially inspired you to pursue engineering as a career, and what was your earliest memory of wanting to be an engineer?

I initially wanted to be a neurosurgeon, but my path shifted in high school while helping my father, an electrician. When a pump failed and he couldn't find a pump technician to fix it, I stepped in and solved the problem. That moment inspired me to pursue engineering, choosing oil over blood.

4. When you reflect on your academic and professional path, what turning point shaped your engineering journey the most?

I discovered my purpose and pursued it with self-motivation. While in campus, I met a civil engineer, initially a stranger,

who later became a close friend and mentor. Through him, I secured my first internship, and his advice still guides me: 'You are the only person in charge of your future; you're responsible for both your failure and prosperity.' I keep these words as a daily reminder.

5. Engineering is often a demanding field. What were some of the biggest challenges you faced as a woman in this profession, and how did you navigate them?

Engineering is demanding, especially when starting out. As a woman, even being top of your class, you must constantly prove your competence. Prioritizing career over your family and vice-versa adds to the challenge. Sometimes you're needed on site in the wee hours while your family also needs you. Mentorship is another gap; when I joined Kenya Railways, there were no women in engineering to look up to, so I had to navigate on my own.

6. What milestones, project or achievements do you consider your proudest moment so far?

I was the youngest registered engineer and the first female registered mechanical engineer at Kenya Railways, where I headed the department in my twenties as Assistant Manager and later the Manager. During my tenure, I successfully led major projects, including the testing and commission of Standard Gauge Railway (SGR) equipment and rolling stock; takeover of SGR rolling stock and locomotive maintenance.

To address gaps in administration hierarchy, I mentored and developed engineers, and ensured every region and workshop nationwide had at least an engineer and assistant engineer. I emphasized both technical and administrative competence and formed the Railways Engineers Forum, a mentorship and community service platform. Before leaving Kenya Railways, I introduced initiatives such as green transport by designing reefer containers (commissioned after my departure), baby-changing

areas in almost all passenger coaches, and the design, testing and commissioning of the business class coach.

I rose from Management Trainee to Manager in charge of Mechanical Engineering for the entire country and network, overseeing both SGR and MGR while there.

7. If you could go back to the early years of your career, what advice would you give your younger self?

Network more. Upskill yourself.

8. What has been your most memorable experience at IEK so far?

Just two months into my role as the CEO of IEK, I planned and hosted the 1st Women Engineers Convention. Despite having no prior event management, the convention was a success, well executed and commendable, even delivered below budget.

9. What roles have you seen IEK play in shaping the engineering landscape of the country?

IEK has greatly advanced advocacy for engineers. These efforts have drawn interest from government, international organizations and the private sector, who now recognize IEK as a leading voice of engineers. While there is still progress to be made, we are on the right track. IEK is also expanding its role in training by offering more technical programs to benefit engineers across the board.

10. As a female engineer, what lessons or experiences would you like to share with young women aspiring to join the profession?

Engineering demands sacrifice and commitment. You must know your worth and bare minimum, while believing in the greater potential within you. Ambition requires understanding where you are, where you want to be, and the steps needed to get there.

11. If one day you were asked to summarize your engineering journey in one word or phrase, what would it be?
